In their unit on the Electromagnetic Spectrum, 7th and 8th-grade students learned about different types of electromagnetic waves and how they form part of the spectrum; visible light. Through a creative project, they applied this knowledge by making faux stained glass artwork using various colors representing components of the light spectrum. This activity allowed them to explore the connection between science and art, as they translated their understanding of wavelengths and colors into visually appealing designs. Working together, students not only deepened their comprehension of scientific concepts but also honed their teamwork and collaboration skills. Overall, the project provided an engaging and hands-on way for students to integrate scientific learning with artistic expression.

MRS. MAYES... 6-8TH GRADE ELA

6th grade: This week, students delved further into our class novel, "Freak the Mighty" by Rodman Philbrick. Our focus was on strengthening comprehension skills, particularly cause and effect -understanding not just what happened, but why it happened. Next week, we'll dive deeper into our literature study of "Freak the Mighty," building upon the insights gained so far.

7th grade: We are making steady progress in our reading of "The Giver" by Lois Lowry. The book offers rich content for us to understand and explore, so it's taking us some time to delve into it thoroughly. Our recent focus has been on grasping the concept of a utopian society and its impact on the characters' daily lives and decisions. It's a fascinating exploration that prompts deep discussions and critical thinking.

8th grade: This week in "The Outsiders," we're examining the similarities and differences between 'the Socs' and 'the Greasers' more closely. Our class has engaged in in-depth discussions about how individuals' social status, whether they have or lack privilege, impacts their stress levels. It's been a thought-provoking exploration of societal dynamics and personal experiences within the novel.

6th grade: Students have one lesson to finish on Monday for the Unit Conversions chapter. They are applying unit conversions to real world situations. We will go over the answers to the review on Tuesday and have our test on Wednesday.

7th grade: Students are midway through the Plane Geometry and Similarity module. They can find the circumference/area of a circle, and the area of a triangle, rectangle and parallelogram. We are now using that knowledge to find the area of a shape composed of those shapes. We will take a quiz over these skills on Wednesday.

8th grade: Students have completed our Pythagorean Theorem module. We discussed and learned about the 3D applications of the Pythagorean theorem. This would be something like packing a candle diagonally in a box and the side length of a pyramid or cone. We are reviewing on Tuesday and the test will be on Wednesday.

The Third Quarter has ended. Next week we will be purging our math folders, so that we have only the materials needed to wrap up the year in the fourth quarter.

6th Grade World Geography: This week students looked at the different ways culture can be organized and the different aspects of American Culture. Next week, we'll look at a different culture and find similarities & differences to ours.

7th-8th Grade U.S. History: This week students learned about the War of 1812 and what was accomplished from the war. Next week, students will have a group project about Manifest Destiny. 6-8th Grade Current Events: This week students
