MRS. CLOUDMAN... 6-8TH GRADE MATH

<u>6th grade:</u> Students are doing a great job with their understanding of beginning algebra. They can write an algebraic expression and evaluate one too. Next week we will look at the parts of an expression, combining like terms and the distributive property.

<u>7th grade:</u> Students spent a little more time reviewing for the Plane Geometry test this week and we will finish the test on Monday. Our next module is Surface area and should be exciting.

<u>8th grade:</u> Students found the volume of cylinders and cones this week and ended with a short (5 problem) quiz on Friday. Next week we look at the volume of spheres and then a short quiz. There will be no module test for Volume.

MR. FOLDENAUER 6-8TH GRADE SOCIAL STUDIES

<u>6th Grade World Geography:</u> This week, students explored how human interactions with the environment have led to the creation of harsh conditions. Next week, we will examine efforts made by various groups to rectify the mistakes of our past. Please note that there will be a quiz next week to assess understanding.

<u>7th-8th Grade U.S. History:</u> This week, students delved into the election of 1824, 1828, and the presidency of Andrew Jackson. Next week, our focus will shift to topics such as the Trail of Tears, the Mexican-American War, and early abolitionists. Please be aware that there will be a quiz next week to gauge comprehension.

<u>6-8th Grade Current Events:</u> This week, students continued their exploration of Israel and how the conflict has evolved since the 20th century. Next week, they will participate in a mock debate to prepare for a class debate on U.S. intervention in the Israel conflict.

MS. PETTY 6-8TH GRADE SCIENCE & KITCHEN CHEMISTRY

- <u>6th Grade Science</u> This week classes began the unit on Weather Patterns: fronts, variables and pressure cells. They are encouraged to watch the weather forecast during the evening news to help incorporate what we are learning in class to daily life. Next week we will continue the unit and also discuss types of cloud formations.
- <u>7th/8th Grade Science</u> During class this week students began learning about Natural Selection and theories that are associated with this topic. Next week, they will begin comparing theories of Darwin and Lamarck.
- <u>Kitchen Chemistry</u> Class had some excitement this week learning about the 5 different flavor profiles and tongue mapping. We ended the topic with a fun jelly bean taste challenge. Next week students will work more on their end of semester project. The project is due NO LATER THAN May 21. Please remind your student to come prepared with a charged Chromebook daily so they can use class time wisely. Late work for the project will not be accepted per the class syllabus that was handed out at the beginning of the semester.
