Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2024-25 educational progress for Webberville High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about accountability, student assessment, and teacher quality. For the 2025-26 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student group in 2024-25. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had at least one student group performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, failed to exit CSI status in 2024-25, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no status label is given. **We are pleased to report that Webberville High School was not given any of these labels.**

Webberville High School is committed to continuous improvement and ensuring that every student has access to high-quality instruction, meaningful support, and multiple pathways to success. While recent data highlight areas for growth in academic proficiency, graduation rate stability, and attendance, these results have helped the school refine and strengthen its improvement efforts. The school is prioritizing strong Tier I instruction, expanded targeted interventions through MTSS, and consistent use of data teams to monitor progress and adjust supports. Additional focus is being placed on academic advising, credit recovery, and alternative pathway options to keep students on track for graduation, along with

strategies to improve attendance and student engagement. Through ongoing professional development, collaborative planning, and a shared commitment to student-centered practices, Webberville High School is building systems designed to accelerate achievement, support diverse learner needs, and close persistent gaps in a positive, supportive learning environment.

State law requires that we also report additional information for the last two years:

- Webberville High School enrolls or assigns all students who live within the district. The school also accepts school of choice enrollment during two specific durations throughout the school year.

- Webberville High School is a public high school serving grades 9-12.

- Additionally, we are required to report the following:

- WHS does not offer advanced placement or college equivalent courses, instead focusing on dual enrollment
- WHS offers the opportunity for postsecondary (dual) enrollment, with the following students enrolled:
  - Fall 2023 - 7 students took 11 classes
  - Spring 2024 - 6 students took 9 classes
  - Fall 2024 - 9 students took 12 classes
  - Spring 2025 - 11 students took 14 classes
  
- The following WHS students received a score leading to college credit:
  - Fall 2023 - 7 students
  - Spring 2024 - 6 students
  - Fall 2024 - 8 students
  - Spring 2025 - 10 students
